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# **01** OVERVIEW

### 

The Aardwolf Forklift Boom FB2-3580 is a robust telescoping attachment designed for forklift trucks ranging from 2 to 5 tonnes. Constructed from high-grade Australian rectangular tube steel (AS1163-450 LO), the boom extends in five increments to suit various lifting applications. Its lifting capacity varies by extension length, with a maximum load of up to 3 tonnes. For secure and stable mounting, the boom is fastened to the forklift using locking bolts and restraint pins. A built-in safety mechanism prevents the inner boom from over-extending, enhancing operational safety during use.

### Key features

- Adjustable reach Telescoping boom with five extension increments for flexible load positioning (1,175 mm - 3,580 mm).
- Variable load capacity Five hook positions support loads ranging from 3,000 kg (fully retracted) to 700 kg (fully extended), depending on the boom length and hook position.
- Heavy-duty construction Made from AS1163-450 LO rectangular tube steel.
- Secure mounting Fastens to forklift blades with locking bolts and restraint pins.
- Built-in safety mechanism Prevents over-extension of the inner boom.
- ➢ Wide compatibility Suitable for 2-5 tonne forklift trucks.







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



### GENERAL GUIDELINES

### 🖉 Training

Operators must be trained and possess the necessary knowledge, skills, and expertise in accordance with industry and regulatory standards for operating the equipment in their region.

Manual Availability

Ensure this manual is readily accessible and fully understood by all operators.

Wear Protective Gear

Always wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE), including safety goggles, gloves, and protective footwear.

➢ Inspect Before Use

Regularly inspect the forklift boom and lifting components for signs of wear, damage, or missing parts.

Use Approved Equipment

Only operate the forklift boom with forklift trucks of suitable rated capacity.

Follow Regulations

Follow all relevant workplace safety regulations and lifting equipment inspection schedules.

Check Load Limits

Always check the manufacturer's load chart for safe lifting limits.

### WARNINGS

### X NEVER

Stand underneath a suspended load or allow others to do so.

**Exceed** the rated capacity of the forklift boom at any extension.

Use counterweights to increase forklift capacity artificially.

Attempt to lift a load if the forklift begins to tip or feel unstable.

Use the boom if it is bent, cracked, or otherwise damaged.

Bypass or remove safety features, including the built-in extension stop.

Attempt to modify the boom without written manufacturer approval.

Lift or move loads that are not properly secured to the hook or lifting device.

### **ALWAYS**

Secure the boom to the forklift with both locking bolts and restraint pins before use. Tilt the forklift mast back toward the driver before lifting a load. **Ensure** the forklift forks are fully inserted into the boom's fork pockets. **Insert** restraint pins behind the fork uprights to prevent forward movement. **Use** the correct hook position and check the corresponding load limit before lifting. **Inspect** lifting gear, such as chains and hooks, before use. Lift and lower the load slowly and steadily. Move the load at the lowest safe travel height. Operate on level ground and avoid sudden stops, starts, or sharp turns.


# **USER INSTRUCTIONS**

### Mounting the Boom

- Insert forklift tines into the boom's fork pockets until they contact the carriage.
- Tighten the locking bolts and insert restraint pins behind the fork uprights.

### 2 Adjusting Boom Extension


- Extend the inner boom to the desired hook position.
- Align holes and insert the locking pin securely.
- 3 Lifting the Load
  - Attach the lifting device to the hook.
  - Secure the load, raise it slowly, and tilt the mast back slightly.
  - If unstable, lower the load and adjust the boom or load position.

### 4 Transporting the Load

- Keep the load at minimum safe travel height.
- Drive slowly; avoid sharp turns, bumps, and sudden stops.
- 5 Placing the Load
  - Position and lower the load gently.
  - Detach the lifting device.
  - Retract and lock the boom if no further



# **04** MAINTENANCE

Inspection

Check for cracks, wear, and secure pins/bolts before each use.

Cleaning

Wipe down regularly and keep dry to prevent corrosion.

Zubrication

Lightly oil moving parts and sliding surfaces as needed.

- Storage Store retracted in a clean, dry place. Use anti-rust spray for long-term storage.
- Replacement

Replace worn/damaged parts with genuine components.

05 WARRANTY

### PRODUCT CHECK AND REPORTING

Upon receiving the product, the buyer should verify, based on the spare parts list and attached spare drawings, that all spare parts are intact and not lost during shipment. Any damages or losses must be officially reported to Aardwolf Industries within eight days of purchase.



### WARRANTY INFORMATION

The product comes with a 12-month warranty from the date of purchase, following Aardwolf Industries warranty policy.



### WARRANTY EXCLUSIONS

### The warranty coverage does not apply if:

- The product is mishandled, misused, or not operated according to its intended purpose.
- >> The user fails to follow the operating and safety instructions provided in this manual.
- The boom is subjected to loads exceeding its specified Working Load Limit (W.L.L.).
- > Damage results from insufficient maintenance, lack of inspection, or neglect.
- >> The boom is stored improperly, resulting in corrosion or structural degradation.
- Unauthorized repairs or modifications are performed without written approval from Aardwolf Industries.
- Non-genuine or unapproved replacement parts are used.
